### CANNED FOOD DRIVE

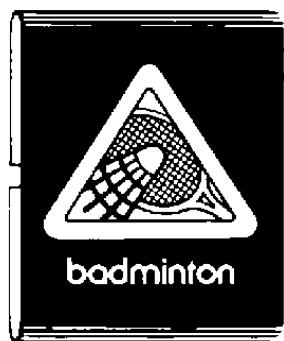

about 50 scouts.

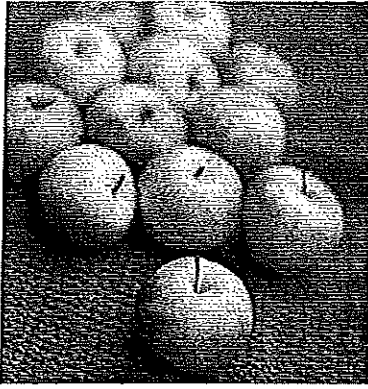
We have pack meetings on the fourth Tuesday of every month at 6:45pm. The other Tuesdays are for den meetings.

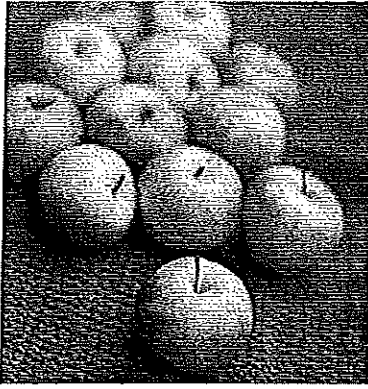

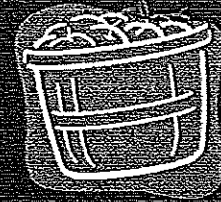
